ACTIVE CASES

The 'Active Cases' under the Pacific Inter-Link Sdn Bhd (PIL) grievance tracker includes grievances that are under review, under investigation or that has not been resolved as yet due to the ongoing engagement.

'Engaged' and 'Monitoring' are PIL's internal status categorisations of the grievance cases that are being actively addressed.

- Engaged cases are actively being addressed, suppliers are positively responsive and further engagement is required towards fair resolution of the grievance cases.
- Monitoring cases are ongoing process of overseeing the progress of suppliers that are committed towards No Deforestation, No Peat and No Exploitation (NDPE) compliance; regular updates from suppliers about their progress; and suppliers that are under long-term monitoring to ensure grievance remains resolved.

RESOLVED CASES

The 'Resolved Cases' under the Pacific Inter-Link Sdn Bhd (PIL) grievance tracker are cases that have been addressed and successfully resolved or closed. In these cases, the non-compliance has been investigated and final decision has been implemented in compliance with our [Sustainable Palm Oil Sourcing Policy](#) and [Grievance Procedure](#).

PIL considers a case is closed under the following criteria:

- Suppliers who have committed to NDPE compliance and are undergoing remediation plan.
- Suppliers who are demonstrating progress in NDPE compliance.

Based on the outcome, there are no important value within or outside the area to be cleared. Therefore, PT KAP decided to conserve the remaining plasma area (150 ha) as HCS area. (Refer to the public announcement by AEP) January 2022: PIL have engaged with AAA Oils & Fats and they are satisfied with PT KAP's effort of conserving the remaining 150 ha plasma area. Compliance to [PIL Group Sustainable Palm Oil Sourcing Policy](#) is crucial to the successful implementation of a transparent, traceable and verified supply chain for PIL. Grievances against PIL's direct and indirect suppliers, brought to our attention about allegations of non-compliance to PIL Sustainable Palm Oil Sourcing Policy, are deliberated by PIL's senior management. Suppliers who do not respond, comply, or compliance cannot be confirmed, with our policy from December 2018, will be suspended from PIL's supply chain as the last resolution.

As for long-term monitoring and continuous improvement, PIL will engage and assist responsive suppliers, to provide support in terms of advisory and guidance to bring back their operations to compliance within 12 months' time period. Suppliers who do not respond to any non-compliance upon engagement within 3-months will be subjected to suspension. Suspended / non-compliant suppliers are required to develop an action plan which includes compensation, conservation or restoration with time bound commitments for all non-compliance (verified cases of deforestation, new development on peatland and/or human rights abuse) after December 2018, to re-enter PIL's supply chain.

The objective of this list is to inform PIL's direct suppliers that products from suspended entities must not enter into PIL's supply chain, and to increase transparency and improve communication to PIL's suppliers and stakeholders. Suppliers that are suspended from PIL's supply chain indicates that they fail to comply with our Sustainable Palm Oil Sourcing Policy, poor sustainability credential and/or failure to respond to our engagement or grievance raised.
